The AHCA held the annual planning session on January 24th. The meeting was attended by all the members of the executive board and other residents (approximately 10). Marie started the meeting with introductions and quickly moved to planning for the **regular meetings for 2008**.

Neighborhood Directory - The directory is finally completed and we will have both paper and electronic copies. It was decided that directories would only be distributed to those who actually live in Alcova Heights. Directories will be available at the Feb. 21 Civic Association meeting. Conservation Plan - Alcova Heights is working to update the Conservation Plan. Cliff Anckaitis is chairing this effort and will be sending out information via the newsletter and listserve asking for volunteers. If you are interested, please contact him at: anckaitisc@comcast.net.

Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee (NCAC) - Alcova Heights participates in the NCAC. The 7th Street sidewalk project continues to move forward and it appears we might be able to get streetlights as well. Cliff Anckaitis is our representative, and we could use a second representative if there is interest.

Civic Association Leadership Structure - There has been some discussion about how to broaden our leadership structure so that our past officers are not afraid to come to a meeting after their term is over. One idea that the current board would like to investigate would be to have an elected leadership/executive committee of 6-10. These roles could be for 2 years each, with rotating terms so we could maintain some continuity. We would still have officers voted on by the neighborhood. All of these ideas need to be explored further to see if they would be feasible, and what the pros and cons of a change would be. Arlington County Civic Federation - Marie VanNess is looking for delegates (we can have 4) who can attend the monthly (Sept-June) Civic Federation meetings. Signs - New signs were purchased to announce Civic Association meetings. Marie is working on having a responsible party for each sign and Sara is investigating how they can be attached to the "Alcova Heights" signs entering the neighborhood. Keeping track of the signs is important as it is costly to replace them.

PROJECTS ISSUES:

Alleys - There is a County discussion on what the use of an alley should be, and Alcova Heights has numerous alleys and a variety of opinions on the options that are best for residents. The usage and care of alleys will be incorporated into the Conservation Plan.

Tree Give Away - The County does an annual tree give away and it was decided that Alcova Heights would again participate. We will need to find a volunteer to coordinate this effort. The tree giveaway is usually associated with Neighborhood Day in May, and the sign-up for the trees will probably be in April. School Boundary Issue - There was a request by a family to ask the Civic Association to write the School Board to defer a potential boundary change for students that use Barcroft's Opt Out for the Modified School Calendar. A draft letter by the parent was provided, asking the School Board to defer its decision until these citizens could have a voice in the process. A Barcroft parent read the letter and made some comments and thought the concept was acceptable. A third citizen offered to make the letter more neutral. The letter was provided back to the Barcroft and the Barrett parents for comment and was then sent to the School Board.

Alcova Heights is a member of the Arlington County Civic Federation (ACCF), an organization of some 82 Arlington county-wide organizations (civic, homeowners), which has been going strong for some 90 years. The ACCF acts as a voice for Arlington by "organizing, discussing and presenting local issues to county officials and assisting member organizations."

I attended the Dec. 4 and Jan. 8 meetings. However, our Civic Association needs to find at least 2 more delegates who would be willing to attend the meetings representing Alcova Heights. We can have 4 delegates, and with monthly meetings from Sept to June, it could be manageable if the responsibility were shared. The meetings are held on the 1st Tuesday of the month, from 7:30 PM to 9:30 PM, and take place at the Hazel Conference Center at the Virginia Hospital Center - parking is available and free. The meetings are efficiently run by Roberts Rule of Order. It is my understanding that one has to be an official delegate in order to ask questions of the various presenters, so it's important to have consistency. So far the subjects covered at the meetings have been: a presentation by the School Board (Dec. 07), a proposal to amend the County Zoning Ordinance to permit Accessory Dwellings (ADS), and the Arlington Medical Reserve Corps (Jan 08). The County Board was invited to the February meeting (Feb. 5).

NEIGHBORHOOD CONSERVATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE VOTES TO APPROVE ALCOVA HEIGHTS SIDEWALK PROJECT

I am delighted to report news from the December 13 Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee meeting that funding was **approved** by a unanimous vote of NCAC membership for Alcova Heights' first priority project - sidewalks, curb, and gutter on 7th Street between Oakland and Quincy. Sidewalks that have been a loooong time in the making are on their way to reality!

The project was priced at a total of \$383k and includes the installation of a 4' sidewalk and 4' utility strip on both sides of the street; tree plantings in the utility strip on both sides of the street; corner intersection nubs at 7th & Oakland and 7th & Quincy; replacement driveway aprons; retaining walls and/or grading if necessary on the south side of 7th; a reduction in the roadway by 4' with the retention of street parking on both sides; and restoration of the roadway with surface paving.

The next step is for the recommendation by NCAC to appear before the County Board for final approval in February 2008.

From that point, the requisite engineering and final design will be completed by Fall 2008. There will be a block meeting once funding has been approved where residents will be provided with an update on the current design. Residents of 7th Street between Oakland and Quincy are encouraged to attend; other interested neighbors are invited as well. This kickoff meeting will be in the basement of the Baptist Church at the corner of 7th and Monroe on **February 28**, 7:30 - 9 PM, in the Fellowship Hall.

After the completion of the design, the project will enter into the construction queue. Early Spring 2009 is the best case for completion of construction, and the latest it is expected to be completed is July 2010.

Thanks much to Cliff Anckaitis for his representation of Alcova Heights on this committee (reps HAVE to go to monthly meetings or else our neighborhood could get kicked out of the program!). Thanks also to all on the block who have been an integral part of this process: Bill Cogswell, Bob Dawson, Mike Rhode, Dana Pulley, and all the block residents who signed on for approval in 2004. This project will help link our neighborhood together, and its approval allows for other Alcova Heights Neighborhood Conservation projects to work their way up to funding. Congratulations, all!

IT'S TAX TIME! FILING HELP IS AVAILABLE AT COLUMBIA PIKE LIBRARY

Low-moderate income taxpayers can get help filling out their tax forms at the Columbia Pike Library from Feb. 2 - April 15. Volunteers are available on Tuesdays from 1:15 - 7:45 PM, and on Thursdays and Saturdays from 10 AM - 2 PM. No appointments are necessary, and volunteers will help people on a first-come, first-served basis. Spanish speakers are available. Bring identification, Social Security Number or Tax Identification Number, tax return from 2007, and W-2 form(s).

According to the Arlington County Library's website, no paper forms for Virginia state taxes will be available there this year. They recommend downloading Virginia tax forms from www.tax.virginia.gov. The library will have basic Federal tax forms, but they are also available online from www.irs.gov/formspubs/index.html.

Conforming Loan Limits May Increase Dramatically

President Bush and leaders in the House of Representatives reached a tentative agreement on 1/24/08 on an economic growth package that includes a measure to allow government- sponsored enterprises Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac to buy mortgages up to \$730,000, a significant increase over the current limit of \$417,000. In addition, Federal Housing Administration (FHA) - backed conforming loan limits would be increased as well - from \$362,000 to \$730,000.

The increased limit on loans eligible to be bought by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac would be temporary, expiring Dec. 31. It was not clear if the higher FHA limit would be temporary or permanent. The Bill isn't expected to be signed for up to 6 weeks.

This proposed plan offers more subprime mortgage holders opportunities to refinance into federally insured loans, and home buyers can purchase a home with a loan value more than the current conforming loan limit of \$417,000, saving thousands of dollars.

Brother Outsider: The Life of Bayard Rustin (2002) THURS., FEB. 21, 6:30 PM (83 minutes)

A film by Nancy Kates, Producer, Bennett Singer, Director, Sam Pollard, Executive Producer.

He was there at most of the important events of the Civil Rights Movement - but always in the background. The film presents a vivid drama about one of the most enigmatic figures in 20th Century American history. One of the first "freedom riders", an advisor to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and A. Philip Randolph, organizer of the march on Washington, intelligent, gregarious and charismatic, Bayard Rustin was denied his place in the limelight for one reason - he was gay. But when the 1963 march on Washington was proposed, the civil rights leadership recognized there was only one man who could organize it - Bayard Rustin. After its overwhelming success Rustin forged the fragile alliance between the labor unions, the civil rights movement and the Democratic Party that was responsible for much of the landmark civil rights legislation of the 1960s.

Distinguished anthropologist Ruth Behar (recipient of a McArthur Genius Award) returns to her native Cuba to profile the island's remaining Sephardic Jews and chronicle her family's journey to the U.S. as Cuban-Jewish exiles. Highlighting themes of expulsion and departure that are at the crux of the Sephardic legacy, Behar seeks reconciliation with Cubans on the island and advocates for the possibility of return and renewal. She debunks the myths about the country's Jewish community and unravels the influence of interfaith marriage, Afro-Cuban santería, tourism and the embargo on contemporary Cuban-Sephardic cultural identity.
